OVERVIEW:

This Brickwork Competition is designed to showcase the skills and creativity of the Level 1 bricklayers. Participants compete in various tasks that test their precision, speed, and craftsmanship in bricklaying. The competition aims to promote excellence in the trade, encourage professional development, and foster a sense of community among bricklayers.

SCENARIO:

As a skilled apprentice bricklayer, you have been commissioned to construct a small decorative brick wall for a community building project. This is an opportunity to impress industry professionals and potential employers by demonstrating precision, creativity, and efficiency under pressure.

Your work must meet high industry standards, combining traditional techniques with innovative design. This is your chance to prove you have the skills to build for the future.

LOCATION:

Bricklaying Workshop

DURATION:

The total amount of time available for the activity is 3 hours including:

- 30 mins – setting up and preparation
- 2 hours – bricklaying and joint finishing
- 30 mins – cleaning and final checks

EQUIPMENT:

You will be provided with the following equipment:

- Bricks (standard clay and contrasting types)
- Mortar and trowels
- Spirit levels, tape measures and string lines
- Profiles and battens

OBJECTIVES:

- **Skill Development:** Enhance participants' bricklaying skills through competitive practice.
- **Recognition:** Provide a platform for bricklayers to gain recognition for their expertise.
- **Community Engagement:** Involve local communities and promote the importance of skilled trades.

- Tasks will be judged on accuracy, speed, and overall quality.

3. Judging Criteria:

- **Precision:** Accuracy in measurements and alignment.
- **Speed:** Time taken to complete the tasks.
- **Aesthetics:** Visual appeal and craftsmanship.
- **Safety:** Adherence to safety protocols during the competition.

4. Awards:

- Prizes for top performers in various categories.
- Certificates of participation for all competitors.

5. Logistics:


- **Venue:** A suitable location with ample space and safety measures.
